# Garden Notes . . . .

## June

Once again June is with us and we should now begin to see the results of our last few weeks' labour. Any one growing tomatoes out of doors can now safely move them out into the open. When planting out make sure that each plant is supported by a strong cane and tie them as they grow. At the same time pinch out all side shoots and be careful with the watering can, too much water can produce poor rooting conditions and even root rot.

Autumn sown onions and onion sets need watching for running to seed and if this occurs snap off each flower head as it appears.

Cold frames which by now should be clear of seedlings should not be allowed to lay idle and a good idea is to fill them with self-blanching celery or a cucumber plant. If cucumbers are grown, whether inside or outside, give them a feed of liquid manure once a week.

If any of the cabbage family are planted out and the ground is dry, make sure they are puddled in. In a final summing up in the vegetable garden a last sowing of carrots can be made this month as well as regular sowing of salad vegetables. Keep potatoes well earthed up and feed onions once a week.

Now to the ladies' choice, namely the flower garden. June is the month when we safely assume the danger of frost is past and plants which



have been suitably hardened off can be planted out in the gardens.

Annuals sown out of doors in the mixed borders will need thinning as soon as they are large enough to handle. Don't let them starve each other.

Cut back all alpinas as they die down on the rock garden. Roses will now be coming into full flower and a dressing of general fertiliser hoed in around them will benefit them, also do not forget to take out any suckers thrown from the briar root. Spray regularly if greenfly appears on the trees, and watch for black spot, which is a purple spot on the leaves. Pick off all leaves affected and burn them.

Keep gardens free of weeds and water only if you must, and then give it a good soaking rather than a light sprinkle.
