Planned Giving Thrives

The first quarterly report shows that our families are giving regularly and generously to the work of God. In the 13 weeks from November 8th to January 31st, the offerings from the families who have pledged amounted to £353. In addition to this there were the offerings from other families and the Sunday Schools, which amounted to £66 during the same period, making a total average of over £32 per week.

More important than the money is the self-sacrifice that it represents, the good and thankful hearts who give in proportion to the way in which God has blessed them.

The Dean will be the Celebrant at the Family Communion on Sunday morning at 9-15 a.m., and in the afternoon he will officiate at the Public Baptism at 3-45 p.m.

During the weekend, therefore, the whole rite of Christian membership will be shown through Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion.

Street Collections

As you know, St. John's Church relies on direct giving for its income and no appeal whatsoever is made from door to door, with raffle and collections in aid of church funds.

The churches are looked to for their support and many members give up their time to collect on behalf of these bodies. The three annual appeals for the Children's Society, Refugees, and Church Lads' Brigade are well established and members of the churches will be working on their behalf.

You can be sure therefore, that anyone who claims to be making an appeal in any form on behalf of St. John's Church is doing so without any authority, and should be reported to the police or the Vicar. There have been two cases recently of people collecting in the name of the church, but such money as they received went into their own pockets.
