Holy Week and Easter Services

Palm Sunday - April 10th

At the Holy Communion there is the blessing and distribution of palms, recalling to us the welcome of the crowds for Jesus as He entered Jerusalem. The crosses should be carefully kept until next year as a continual reminder of the passion of our Lord.

Monday

Holy Communion 6-30 a.m.

Tuesday

There will be a film at 7-45 p.m. on the life of one of the saints, and the Young Wives' choir will sing some music for Holy Week. The evening will close with the beautiful service of Compline.

Wednesday

Holy Communion 9-15 a.m.

Maundy Thursday

This is the night of the Last Supper when Jesus gave his church the service of Holy Communion. In great thanksgiving then, we shall have a **Family Communion in the evening at 7-45 p.m.** But Good Friday is to follow, and so after the Communion the altar and sanctuary are stripped bare, and the church prepares to keep an **All Night Vigil**

On the night of His arrest, Jesus rebuked the disciples for falling asleep whilst he prayed in the garden of Gethsemane. "What, could ye not watch with me one hour?" The church therefore keeps vigil through the night and you are asked to come and watch with Christ through one hour of the night. The Vigil ends on **Good Friday**

Matins, Litany and Ante-Communion, 9 a.m.

A **Family Service** will be held from 2-3 p.m. at St. John Baptist, and will be taken by Fr. B. Humphreys, Rector of Fiskerton.

Easter Even (Saturday)

The **Easter Vigil**, 8 p.m., marks the end of Lent and the beginning of Easter, and is one of the most impressive services of the year. With the church in darkness the Easter candle is blessed and lighted, and carried into the church as a symbol of the risen Christ, the light of the world. Five nails are inserted into the wax representing the wounds which the risen body of Christ still bore. As the candle is borne on procession through the darkened church tapers are lit from it and the flame is carried from candle to candle through out the church. So we see the symbol of the light of Christ spreading into every darkened corner, dispersing all the shades of night.

Everyone then joins in the renewal of their baptismal vows, and the Easter candle is left burning all night until the church has gathered in the morning for the Holy Communion of Easter.
