CHRISTIAN AID WEEK

UNITED EFFORT BY THE CHURCHES FOR REFUGEES MAY 9th-14th

In Christian Aid Week the Churches of the United Kingdom are acting together to raise £500,000. They will send it for immediate work among refugees -emigrating them to new countries, getting them out of the camps of Europe and the hovels of the Far East, re-housing them, training them for jobs, caring for the old and the sick.

For those in need.

The organisation which actually does this work of rehabilitation and relief is the Refugee Service of the World Council of Churches. In Europe it acts on behalf of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees who has no operational staff of his own; in other parts of the

world it acts independently. does'nt matter what the refugee's religion is, or even if he has no religion at all; his sole qualification

In this way the Churches of the world have already resettled over 200,000 refugees in new counrites and jobs overseas, and in World Refugee Year they are expected to resettle by one means or another a further 40,000 at least. But they can carry out these responsibilities only if we help them to do so by providing the funds. Money is by far the most valuable commodity. You cannot resettle people permanently without it, and refugees have had enough of temporary measures.
