(5) Church Services are not dull or long winded occasions, but the gathering together of God's family to offer joyful worship, and to receive the gifts of our Lord Jesus Christ.

(6) The Holy Communion isn't an occasional service. In the New Testament we find that the Lord's People met at the Lord's Service on the Lord's Day. One of the few commands that Jesus gave was, "Do this, in remembrance of me."

St. John's Evergreen Club

Welfare Clinic

On Wednesday afternoon, June 6th, and on all future Wednesdays a Welfare Clinic will be held in St. John's Hall.

A doctor will be in attendance to examine the children, and advice can be sought from the Health Visitors, who are qualified nurses.

Welfare foods will be on sale, and the necessary stamps can also be obtained from the clinic. If you wish, your children can be immunised against diphtheria and whooping cough, and vaccinated against small-pox.

The Confirmation School

When children are baptised at Church of England fonts their God-parents promise "that they will be brought to the Bishop to be confirmed by him; so that, strengthened with the gift of the Holy Spirit, they may come with due preparation to receive the Holy Communion of the Body and Blood of Christ, and may go forth into the world to serve God faithfully in the fellowship of his church."

Boys and girls join the Infant's Confirmation School at four years of age, go up to the Junior School at 7 years and then to the Senior school for their final three years of preparation at 10½. But of course the best preparation of all is for parents to bring their children to the Family Communion week by week. *The family that prays together stays together.*
