Dedication of its Sanctuary to ST. JOHN BAPTIST

THE LORD BISHOP OF LINCOLN

20th JANUARY, 1956 at 7.30 p.m. When the people are assembled, the Bishop and his Chaplain shall be received by the Vicar and Churchwardens of the Parish, and the Vicar shall pray the Bishop to open and dedicate the Building.

Reverend Father in God, we pray you to open and dedicate this Church Hall.

To which the Bishop shall say:

I am ready to proceed to the opening and dedication.

During the singing of the Psalm the Bishop shall be conducted to his seat.

Psalm cxxi.

I will lift up my eyes unto the hills: from whence cometh my help.

My help cometh even from the Lord: Who hath made heaven
and earth.

He will not suffer thy foot to be moved; and He that keepeth

thee will not sleep.

Behold. He that keepeth Israel: shall neither slumber nor sleep. The Lord Himself is thy keeper: the Lord is thy defence upon thy right hand.

So that the sun shall not burn thee by day: neither the moon

by night.

The Lord shall preserve thee from all evil: yea, it is even He that shall keep thy soul.

The Lord shall preserve thy going out, and thy coming in: from

this time forth for evermore.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

The Bishop shall then speak to the people.

Within these walls may harsh thoughts be subdued, and unkind words unspoken, and may those who shall learn the way of Thy statutes, walk before Thee with a perfect heart, and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life; who with the Father and the Holy Ghost ever livest one God, world without end. Amen.

The Bishop, standing at the Holy Table and turning to the people, shall sav:

Then the Bishop shall say:

Who has yet been graciously pleased to promise Thy special presence where two or three are gathered together in Thy Name; Vouchsafe, O Lord, to be present with us who are gathered here to set apart this place to the honour of Thy great Name; accept we beseech Thee, at our hands, this Sanctuary for the promotion of Thy Glory, the ministration of Thy Word and Sacraments, and the salvation of Thy people, through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

- V. This is the bread which cometh down from heaven:

Then, the people kneeling, the Bishop shall say:

Let us pray,

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who hast given Thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ not only to die for us, but also to be our spiritual food and sustenance in the Holy Sacrament of His Body and Blood; grant that the memorial of His death may here be made with reverence and godly fear, and the sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving be offered with holiness and joy, to the honour of Thy glorious name, the benefit of Thy whole Church, and the comfort of souls that feed upon Him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, to Whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

Vouchsafe, O Lord, our God, to bless, hallow, and consecrate this Altar to Thine honour, and for the perpetual memorial of the one Oblation once offered upon the Cross; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth, with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

The Altar shall then be vested and the Bishop shall continue:

In the Faith of Jesus Christ we dedicate these adornings of the Holy Table in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Our Father, which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil; For Thine is the kingdom, The Power and the glory, For ever and ever. Amen.

Then shall all the people, still kneeling, sing the following hymn: Hymn 157.

> Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire, And lighten with celestial fire; Thou the anointing Spirit art, Who dost Thy sevenfold gifts impart:

The blessed unction from above is comfort, life, and fire of love; Enable with perpetual light The dullness of our blinded sight:

Anoint and cheer our soiled face With the abundance of Thy grace: Keep far our foes, give peace at home; Where Thou art Guide no ill can come.

Teach us to know the Father, Son, And Thee, of Both, to be but One; That through the ages all along This may be our endless song,

> Praise to Thy eternal merit, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Then shall the Bishop arise and say, the people standing:

In the Faith of Jesus Christ we dedicate this Church Hall in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Grant, O Lord, that those who shall receive in this place the blessed Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ may come to this holy Mystery with repentance and faith, thanksgiving and love; and being fulfilled with Thy grace and heavenly benediction, may obtain remission of their sins, and all other benefits of His Passion. Amen.

Grant that those who come here to the Holy Communion may offer themselves, their souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto Thee. Ainen.
