#### TAKING

## Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to bless in their several callings all thy servants who are labouring for the building up of thy Church and the spread of thy gospel, that the whole world may be filled with the knowledge of thy truth;

## Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to bless all thy people, and especially the congregation of this church; that they may be made worthy ministers unto thee, and serve thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of their life;

#### Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to bless thy chosen servant, Elizabeth, our most gracious Queen and Governor, that she, knowing whose minister she is, may above all things seek thy honour and glory;

## Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to lead all nations in the way of righteousness and peace; and so to direct their rulers, and all who bear authority in them, that thy people may be justly and quietly governed;

Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to bless this place, and all who dwell and work in it, that they may praise thee by living according to thy will;

#### Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to bless to our use the fruits of the earth in their season, that we may with thankful hearts enjoy them;

## Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee, of thy goodness, O Lord, to comfort and succour all those who in this transitory life are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity;

#### Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to grant to all thy servants departed this life in thy faith and fear mercy, light and peace;

#### Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

That it may please thee to give us so to follow the good examples of thy saints, that we may be partakers of thy heavenly kingdom;

Hear us, we beseech thee, O Lord.

#### THE INVITATION

YE that do truly and earnestly repent you of your sins, and are in love and charity with your neighbours, and intend to lead a new life, following the commandments of God, and walking from henceforth in his holy ways; draw near with faith, and take this holy Sacrament to your comfort; and make your humble confession to Almighty God, meekly kneeling upon your knees.

#### THE CONFESSION

ALMIGHTY God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Maker of all things, Judge of all men: we acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, which we, from time to time, most grievously have committed, by thought, word and deed, against thy Divine Majesty, provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; the remembrance of them is grievous unto us; the burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; for thy Son our Lord Iesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, to the honour and glory of thy name: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### THE ABSOLUTION

ALMIGHTY God, our heavenly Father, who of his great mercy hath promised forgiveness of sins to all them that with hearty repentance and true faith turn unto him; have mercy upon you; pardon and deliver you from all your sins; confirm and strengthen you in all goodness; and bring you to everlasting life; though Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## THE COMFORTABLE WORDS

Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all that truly turn to him:

Come unto me all that travail and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you. So God loved the world, that he gave his onlybegotten Son, to the end that all that believe in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Hear also what Saint Paul saith:

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious name; evermore praising thee, and saying,

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth arc full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most High.

Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: hosanna in the highest.

#### THE PRAYER OF HUMBLE ACCESS

WE do not presume to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table. But thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy; grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his Body, and our souls washed through his most precious Blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

#### THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

ALMIGHTY God, our heavenly Father, who of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death, until his coming again;

Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood:

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying: Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me. Amen.

The celebrant shall break the bread before the people saying

The Bread which we break, is it not a communion of the Body of Christ?

#### THE FOURTH ACTION

## SHARING THE COMMUNION

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### THE PRAYER OF OBLATION

WHEREFORE, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy humble servants entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee, that all we, who are partakers of this Holy Communion, may be fulfilled with they grace and heavenly benediction.

And although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. Amen.

## THE THIRD COLLECT, FOR AID AGAINST ALL PERILS

LIGHTEN our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord; and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Antiphon: How great is your name, O Lord our God through all the earth!

- 1 Your majesty is praised above the heavens; on the lips of children and of babes you have found praise to foil your enemy, to silence the foe and the rebel.
- 2 When I see the heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and the stars which you arranged, what is man that you should keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him?
- 3 Yet you have made him little less than a god; with glory and honour you crowned him, gave him power over the works of your hand, put all things under his feet.
- 4 All of them, sheep and cattle, yes, even the savage beasts, birds of the air, and fish that make their way through the waters.

How great is your name, O Lord our God through all the earth!

5 Give glory to the Father Almighty, to his Son, Jesus Christ, the Lord, to the Spirit, who dwells in our hearts, both now and for ever. Amen.

Antiphon: His goodness shall follow me always, to the end of my days.

- 1 The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit.
- 2 He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff; with these you give me comfort.
- 3 You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes. My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing.
- 4 Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever.
- 5 To the Father and Son give glory, give glory to the Spirit.
  To God who is, who was, and who will be for ever and ever.

- Antiphon 1. I will go to the altar of God, praise the God of my joy.
- Antiphon 2. Send forth your light and your truth: let these be my guide.
- 1 Defend me, O God, and plead my cause against a godless nation; from deceitful and cunning men rescue me, O God.
- 2 Since you, O God, are my stronghold, why have you rejected me? Why do I go mourning, oppressed by the foe?
- 3 O send forth your light and your truth, let these be my guide; let them bring me to your holy mountain, to the place where you dwell.
- 4 And I will come to the altar of God, the God of my joy.
  My Redeemer, I will thank you on the harp, O God, my God!
- 5 Why are you cast down, my soul, why groan within me? Hope in God, I will praise him still, my Saviour and my God
- 6 Praise the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit, both now and for ever, the God who is, who was and who will be, world without end.

Antiphon 1. Have mercy, Lord; cleanse me from all my sins.

Antiphon 2. Lord, if you will, you can make me clean.

- 1 Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offence. O wash me more and more from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin.
- 2 My offences truly I know them; my sin is always before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned; what is evil in your sight I have done.
- 3 That you may be justified when you give sentence and be without reproach when you judge, O see, in guilt I was born, a sinner was I conceived.
- 4 Indeed you love truth in the heart; then in the secret of my heart teach me wisdom. O purify me, then I shall be clean; O wash me, I shall be whiter than snow.
- 5 Make me hear rejoicing and gladness, that the bones you have crushed may thrill. From my sins turn away your face and blot out all my guilt.
- 6 A pure heart create for me, O God, put a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, nor deprive me of your holy spirit.

- 7 Give me again the joy of your help; with a spirit of fervour sustain me, that I may teach transgressors your ways, and sinners may return to you.
- 8 O rescue me, God, my helper, and my tongue shall ring out your goodness. O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth shall declare your praise.
- 9 For in sacrifice you take no delight, burnt offering from me you would refuse, my sacrifice, a contrite spirit. A humbled, contrite heart you will not spurn.
- 10 [In your goodness, show favour to Sion: rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. Then you will be pleased with lawful sacrifice, then you will be offered young bulls on your altar.]
- 11 Give glory to the Father Almighty, to his Son, Jesus Christ, the Lord, to the Spirit who dwells in our hearts, both now and for ever. Amen.

Antiphon 1. Glory to you, O God! Antiphon 2. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

1 Cry out with joy to the Lord, all the earth. Serve the Lord with gladness. Come before him, singing for joy.

- 2 Know that he, the Lord, is God. He made us, we belong to him, we are his people, the sheep of his flock.
- 3 Go within his gates, giving thanks. Enter his courts with songs of praise. Give thanks to him and bless his name.
- 4 Indeed, how good is the Lord, eternal his merciful love; he is faithful from age to age.
- 5 Give glory to the Father Almighty, to his Son, Jesus Christ, the Lord, to the Spirit who dwells in our hearts.

Antiphon 1. O Lord, my God, deliver me!

Antiphon 2. When I cry to the Lord,
he hears my prayer.

- I I love the Lord for he has heard the cry of my appeal; for he turned his ear to me, in the day when I called him.
- 2 They surrounded me, the snares of death, with the anguish of the tomb; they caught me, sorrow and distress, I called on the Lord's name.
  O Lord, my God, deliver me!

- 3 How gracious is the Lord, and just; our God has compassion. The Lord protects the simple hearts, I was helpless so he saved me.
- 4 Turn back, my soul, to your rest for the Lord has been good, he has kept my soul from death, [my eyes from tears] and my feet from stumbling.
- 5 I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living. Praise the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit, for ever and ever.

- Antiphon 1. My help comes from God, who made heaven and earth.
- Antiphon 2. The Lord will protect you from all evil and he will guard your soul.
- 1 I lift up my eyes to the mountains: from where shall come my help? My help shall come from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.
- 2 May he never allow you to stumble! Let him sleep not, your guard! No, he sleeps not, nor slumbers, Israel's guard!

- 3 The Lord is your guard and your shade; at your right side he stands.
  By day the sun shall not smite you, nor the moon in the night.
- 4 The Lord will guard you from evil, he will guard your soul. The Lord will guard your going and coming, both now and for ever.
- 5 Praise the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit, both now and for ever, the God who is, who was and who will be, world without end.

- Antiphon 1. We shall go up with joy to the house of our God.
- Antiphon 2. For love of the house of the Lord I will pray for your good
- 1 I rejoiced when I heard them say: "Let us go to God's house." And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem.
- 2 Jerusalem is built as a city strongly compact. It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord.

- 3 For Israel's law it is there to praise the Lord's name. There were set the thrones of judgment, of the house of David.
- 4 For the peace of Jerusalem, pray: "Peace be to your homes! May peace reign in your walls, in your palaces, peace!"
- 5 For love of my brethren and friends, I say: "Peace upon you!" For love of the house of the Lord I will ask for your good.
- 6 Praise the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit, both now and for ever, the God who is, who was and is to come at the end of the ages.


Antiphon: Have mercy upon us, O Lord.

- 1 To you have I lifted up my eyes, you who dwell in the heavens: my eyes, like the eyes of slaves on the hand of their lords.
- 2 Like the eyes of a servant on the hand of her mistress, so our eyes are on the Lord our God till he show us his mercy.

- 3 Have mercy on us, Lord, have mercy: we are filled with contempt. Indeed, all too full is our soul with the proud man's disdain.
- 4 Praise the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit, both now and for ever, the God who is, who was and who will be, world without end.

Antiphon: Those who sow in tears and sorrow, one day will reap with joy.

- 1 When the Lord, delivered Sion from bondage, it seemed like a dream.
  Then was our mouth filled with laughter, on our lips there were songs.
- 2 The heathens, themselves said: "What marvels the Lord worked for them!" What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed, we were glad.
